

ALLOCATION OF SECONDARY SCHOOL PLACES IN SURREY FOR SEPTEMBER 2017

The data in the table below sets out the secondary allocation figures for Surrey's secondary schools as of 1 March 2017. In some cases vacancies remained after the initial allocation to on time applicants and these were filled by applicants who had applied late. Where no measurement is shown, all applicants who applied on time were offered a place. In all other cases the measurement relates to the last criterion for which places were offered. All distances quoted are in kilometres.
