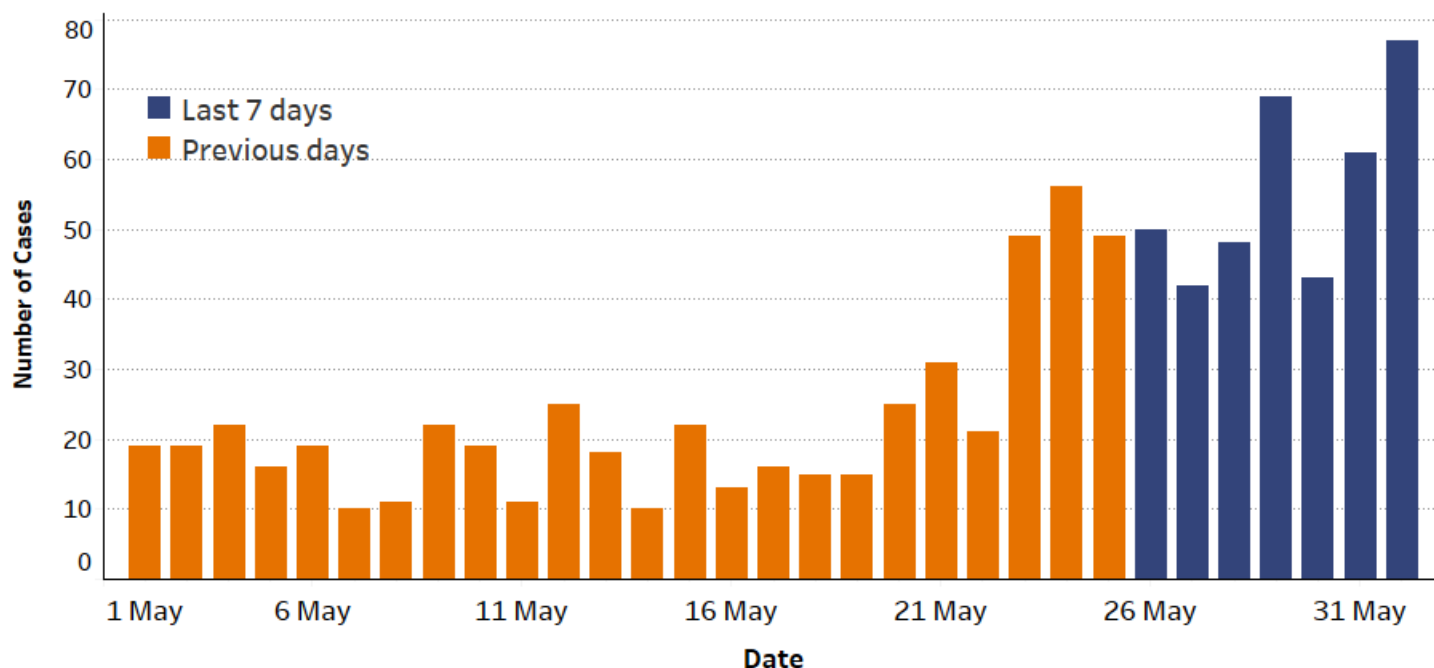

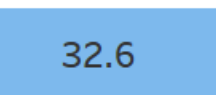

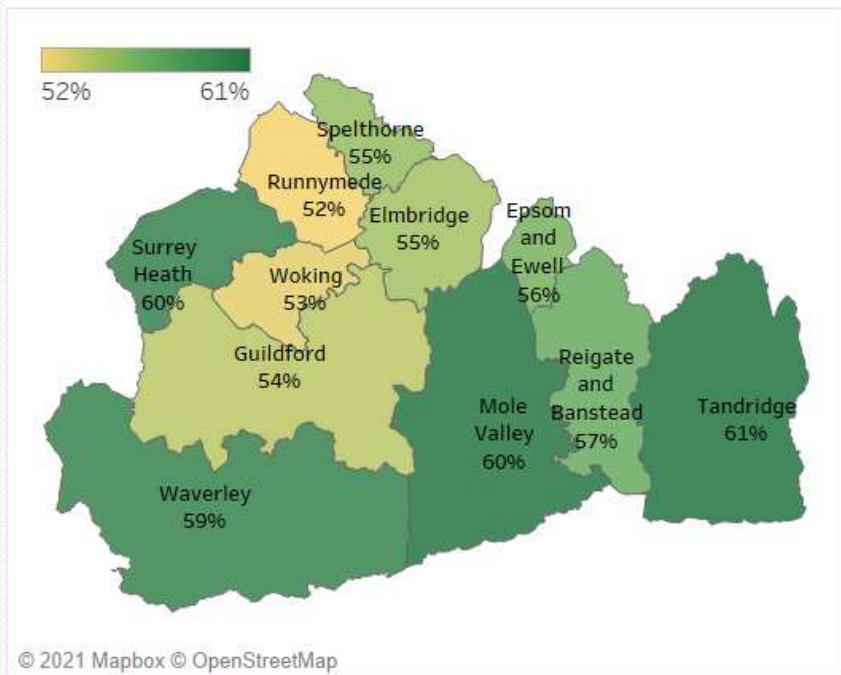

**27,990** people in Surrey have received their first dose, and **51,877** have received their second dose of a COVID-19 vaccination this week (23rd May to 30th May).

In total **734,840** people (**56%** of the population) have received at least one dose of a vaccine, and **469,233** people (**36%** of the population) have received two doses of a vaccine (up to 30th May). **91%** of all people aged 50 or over in Surrey have received at least one dose of a vaccine.

**56%** of all people in the South East have had at least 1 dose of a vaccine, and **36%** have had a second dose, compared to **53%** and **35%** of people in England.

### Groups currently eligible for a vaccine

- People aged 30 and over
- People who are clinically vulnerable and clinically extremely vulnerable
- People who live or work in care homes
- Health and social care workers
- People with a learning disability
- People who are a main carer for someone at high risk (clinically extremely vulnerable)
