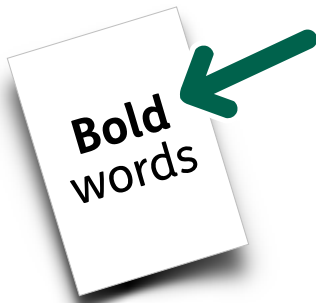

# Introduction

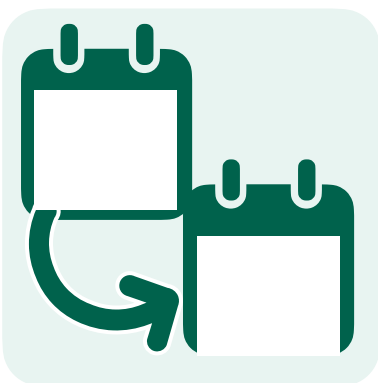


Surrey County Council has written this plan for:

# What we want



We want our services to:

- Help people to be independent and to be able to get the things that they want.



- Help people to be healthy and make the most of their lives.



- Help disabled people to be involved and join in with the things they like.



- Be right for each person and their family.



- Change when the person needs a different type of support as they grow older.



- Help people to try out new things, safely.

# Changing support



Our plans look at how support needs to change as people feel they can do more things.



Our services need to learn from what works well.



As disabled people become more confident in what they can do, there needs to be changes in the way:

- We support people.
- Community groups work with people.
- Businesses treat people.





# Our priorities



**Priorities** are important things that should be done first.

Our 6 priorities are:



1. Helping local neighbourhoods and businesses to be more **accessible** and welcome disabled people.

**Accessible** means it is easy to use and suitable for people with different needs.



2. Making housing better for disabled people, so that people have more choice over where they live.



3. Helping people have more choice and control over their support so they can become more independent.





4. Giving more training to staff to make them better at helping and supporting disabled people.



5. Making sure carers have all the support they need.



6. Working better with other services, such as health services.

## The way we run services

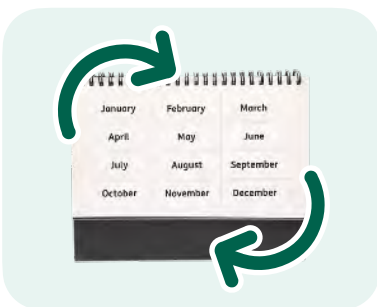


We also want to work with disabled people to set up a new way of running services.



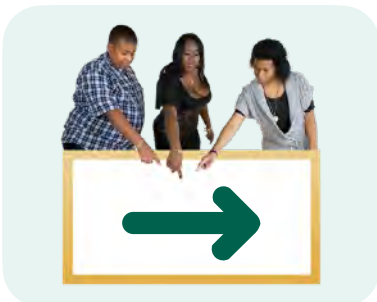
## More different services
