




Information about these subjects will be contained in log books, school magazines and in managers' or governors' minutes. The following references are included as examples and are merely indicative of what can be found.

The log book of Dunsfold Church of England School (SHC ref 5307/2) includes references to subscriptions to 'the Great Victory Loan', 1917, and the admission of a refugee from air raids, 1918; that of Ewhurst Church of England Primary School (SHC ref 2133/1) refers to the admission of Belgian refugees in 1914 and air raid precautions in 1917; that of St James School, Weybridge (SHC ref 2011/2) refers to the school being used as the start of the war for troops marching to Pirbright and Aldershot, the absence of Boy Scouts on guard duty at bridges and junctions and at the aerodrome, the introduction in 1918 of a school dinner scheme by the Weybridge Food Economy Committee, and the death of the former school captain and English soccer international Brian Brooker.

The school magazine of Upland House School, Epsom, for the war years, gives news of old boys and comments on the progress of the war (SHC ref 2289/1) and the reports of the headmaster of Archbishop Abbot's School, Guildford, also refer to war conditions (SHC ref 1535/2/2); the school magazine of Farnham Grammar School (SHC ref 8102/1/13) includes news from serving old boys, with many letters to the headmaster the Rev S Priestley reproduced, and obituaries of those killed.

Rolls of honour or lists of former pupils killed or wounded are held for Boxgrove School, Merrow (SHC ref 8688/5/2); Rutlish School, Merton (SHC ref 3641/17/4/1, with cuttings book relating to those serving, 3641/17/5/3); and can also be found in the log book of Farnham British School (SHC ref CC387/9); the speech day programme of the Royal Grammar School, Guildford, 1916 (SHC ref 8024/8); and the report of the committee of St John's Foundation School, Leatherhead, 1916 (SHC ref 3743/1). The Gordon School, Woking, which traditionally sent many boys into the army, gives details of those killed in its admission registers (SHC ref 8201/8/-), rolls of honour (SHC ref 8210/10/13-14) and Quarterly Gazette (SHC ref 8210/10/-).

The History Centre also holds a memorial banner for pupils of Westfield School, Woking, made from embroidery and applique work, and recording 33 names (SHC ref CC388/3/1).
