

Community Recycling Centre (CRC) charging waste scheme

Surrey County Council (SCC) charges for the disposal of some non-household waste materials at its CRCs. The charges are for:

- Waste from the construction, alteration or repair of homes and gardens (including plasterboard).
- Tyres from cars, motorcycles and all other motorised vehicles (including non-motorised vehicles and trailers pulled by a motorised vehicle).

The table below is a list of waste materials with guidance on how to dispose of them.

For large home renovation projects please factor in the cost of hiring a skip to dispose of your waste. Our sites are not designed to accept large quantities of this type of waste.

Similarly if type of waste arising from the construction, alteration or repair of your home and garden construction waste to one of our Community Recycling Centres which is NOT on the above list, **or is deemed a commercial quantity**, you will be redirected to a [waste transfer station](#) where your waste will be weighed and commercial charges made.

Note there is NO maximum quantity charge for bagged materials

Tyres

- A part tyre will be charged as one tyre
- The same charge per tyre applies to rimmed and non-rimmed tyres
- No limit on the number of tyres to be charged for
- No commercial or agricultural tyres accepted

Gypsum

- must have tiles, foam or other material removed

Items and bags

- Charge of **£4** per bag **OR** per item
- See Table 2 for details of waste material types that carry a charge
 - Bag = no bigger than 50cm x 77cm
 - Item = see list of items on Table 2
 - No part bag charges – a part bag will be charged as one bag

Loose loads

- Unbagged waste that is all inerts

Where charges are applicable, payment must be made to a Charging Scheme Officer at the entrance prior to the customer being granted access to the chargeable containers to tip their waste. Charges are non-negotiable and the decision of the site staff is final.

Chargeable waste arising from construction, alteration or repair of your home and garden*:

Please note: This list is not exhaustive

Charge per bag (50cm x 77cm) of:

- 1 x bag of breeze blocks
- 1 x bag of bricks
- 1 x bag of cement (set and bagged)**
- 1 x bag of concrete
- 1 x bag of drainpipes (ceramic types)
- 1 x bag of flagstones / paving slabs
- 1 x bag of gravel
- 1 x bag of hardcore (rubble)
- 1 x bag of rocks
- 1 x bag of rubble
- 1 x bag of sand
- 1 x bag of slates
- 1 x bag of soil
- 1 x bag of stones
- 1 x bag of tarmac
- 1 x bag of tiles (ceramic/clay/slate)
- 1 x bag of turf
- 1 x bag of marble
- 1 x bag of granite
- 1 x bag of plasterboard*** including other gypsum containing products and room partitions (must have tiles, foam or other material removed)

Please note: This list is not exhaustive

Per item OR car boot load of:

- 1 x concrete fence post
- 1 x concrete gravel board
- 1 x piece of set cement**
- 1 x shower tray - ceramic
- 1 x bath - ceramic
- 1 x toilet pan
- 1 x cistern
- 1 x wash basin
- 1 x sink
- 1 x bidet
- 1 x paving slab (600mm x 600mm)
- 1 x piece of formed concrete
- 1 x length of ceramic pipe
- 1 x piece of marble
- 1 x piece of granite
- 1 x sheet of plasterboard*** no larger than 1200mm x 2400mm including other gypsum containing products and room partitions (must have tiles, foam or other material removed)

Note:

*Asbestos must not be disposed of with any of the above materials. For advice on safe disposal of asbestos please visit the [Asbestos pages on the SCC website](#).

**Only cured (set) cement accepted

***Plasterboard must be disposed of in the dedicated plasterboard container

Waste accepted free of charge (which would previously have been disposed of in the bin for hardcore / rubble):

- Crockery / Clay flower pots / Clay garden ornaments
- Free standing wood based furniture / shelves / ornaments / kennels / hutches / planters etc
