Sarah said she thinks it would be a good idea with have something more sociable in future sessions. Sarah likes the mixture of both in person and at home as she thinks this makes it






more accessible to people. People in the group also gave thumbs up to the idea of hybrid meetings.

 She told people about the new Direct Payment Strategy which is now on the council website and asked people to complete the

Marnie also told people about the new travel policy survey which closes on 13 November. This information was recently sent in Latest News.



Marnie also mentioned new travel training that is open to everyone. Referrals to be made through the Adult Social Care team.

Recently, some members joined Active Prospects to walk the 100km South Coast Challenge.

Michael said the walk took 4 days which they really enjoyed doing.
They walked 63 miles in total and raised just over £10,000 which is going towards to



sensory equipment for services.



Local Updates and Any Other Business




Matt Lole from the YMCA East talked about what they are
