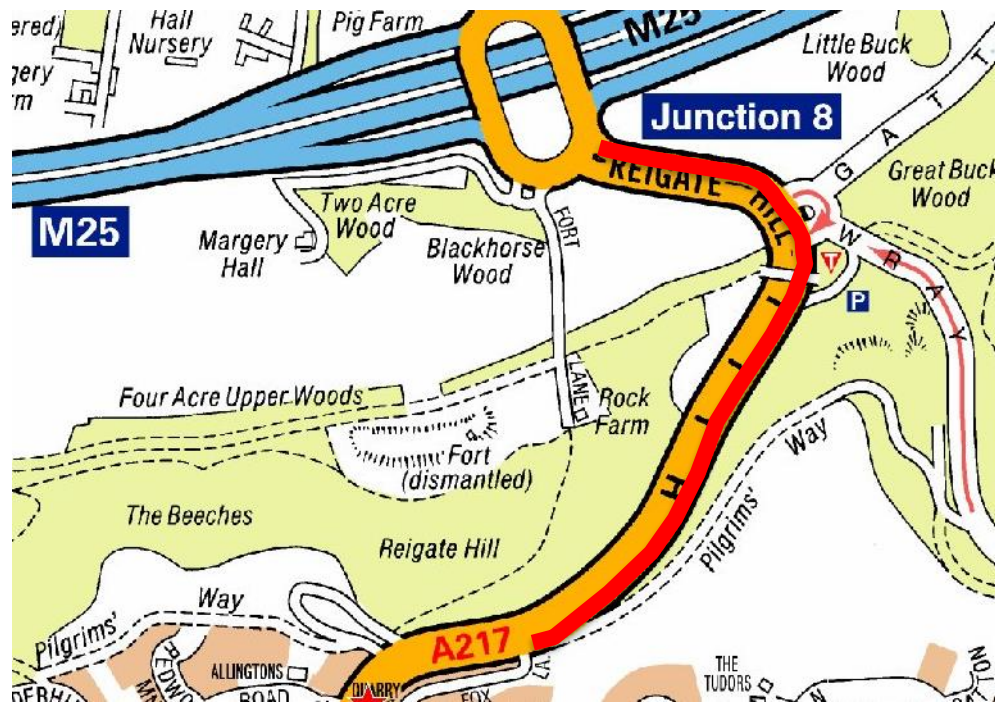

What we are doing

We will be repairing the 240m long retaining wall and replacing the vehicle barrier that runs along Reigate Hill. The existing structure is damaged and no longer fit for purpose. A permanent repair is essential to ensure the A217 remains safe.

Information for residents and businesses

Reigate Hill, Reigate will be closed Southbound at the exit from the M25 J8 roundabout whilst we carry out our works. A signed diversion route will be in place.

The road will remain open northbound, enabling access to the Hotel and properties along Reigate Hill to be maintained. The Reigate Hill café and car park will remain open and can be accessed via Wray Lane and Gatton Bottom.

The red line indicates the road closure and area we will be working in.

Why is a Southbound closure the best option?

Temporary traffic lights, a full closure, narrowing the carriageway to two lanes and night works were all considered, but these would all be either more disruptive, or less safe, than a closure in one direction for the duration of the works.
