





North West Surrey Local Valuing People Group Minutes

The meeting was at the Maybury Centre in Woking and Teams.






What people wanted to see more of and how to improve services in Surrey

Presentation by LinkAble and Questions

Rachel at LinkAble gave a talk about the activities they run and upcoming events.



Lorna spoke about what Linkable meant to her. She said Linkable has helped her to learn lots of new skills and has helped her to build her confidence, even when things don't go to plan all the time.



Lorna has been with the service since she was 7 years old and she enjoys taking part in different activities like choir and drama.



She also shadows the reception team and she has learnt a lot doing this.



Hannah said that Linkable has been able to help her with courage, social skills and developing her independence. She attends drama class, chill out on Wednesday and Hobby Club. Cooking, drama, and travel training are some of skills she has learnt.



LinkAble is a charity that supports children and adults with learning disabilities in Woking and Surrey. They run a variety of onsite activities at their Woking Centre as well as offsite.



There are activities taking place 5 days a week including evening clubs. The evening social groups take place on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday. Saturday evenings is Mayhem Club nights which are usually between 7-11pm and Sunday is ActAbles Drama Group for 16+ from 11:15pm-1pm.





The next Mayhem Club Night is taking place at on 17th February at their new venue Fiery Bird.

Discussion



Carinder said it was great to see the amazing work LinkAble are doing.

Amanda asked how many people attend Mayhem.

Rachel said at least 100 people attend the club nights, but the new venue can hold at least 150 people.



Phil asked whether there was a quiet place available should people need this.



Rachel said there was space available at the venue for people should they need this.



Amanda said she was also hoping to attend the next Mayhem event.



Helen asked about where their evening activities take place.

Rachel said most of the evening activities take place onsite at their Woking Centre.

There are some activities like eating out or bowling which would be offsite.

Carinder whether they had any easy read formats for their activities or for a timetable?

Rachel said they did have easy read available and she was working on a new easy read timetable.

Carla asked the costs for the sessions.

Rachel said that from April there would be £40 charge for most sessions. Thursday group £15 which is pay as you go, drama group is £12.50 and Mayhem is £7.

Presentation and Feedback from Surrey Choices



Carinder introduced the presentation by Surrey Choices on Social Activities.

Key Points



 Ioanis is from Cranstock activity centre. As of last year, Woking Centre and Cranstock have merged together to host a wide range of activities and support for people with learning disabilities and autism in the community.



 They run a wide range of activities including gardening, cookery and arts and crafts. Outdoor activities include Badminton, soft play and gym sessions.



- Claire said she enjoyed playing Badminton.
- Ajay said he likes painting and doing woodwork. He also participates in gardening.







- They are one big family.
- They have travel training, bowling, swim sessions, golf, shopping, days out.
- They give options to members on what they want to do and this encourages their independence.

Helen asked about what sort of things they grow in the garden.


loanis said they grow herbs and some vegetables. Ajay said gardening can be quite hard work but he enjoys it.
