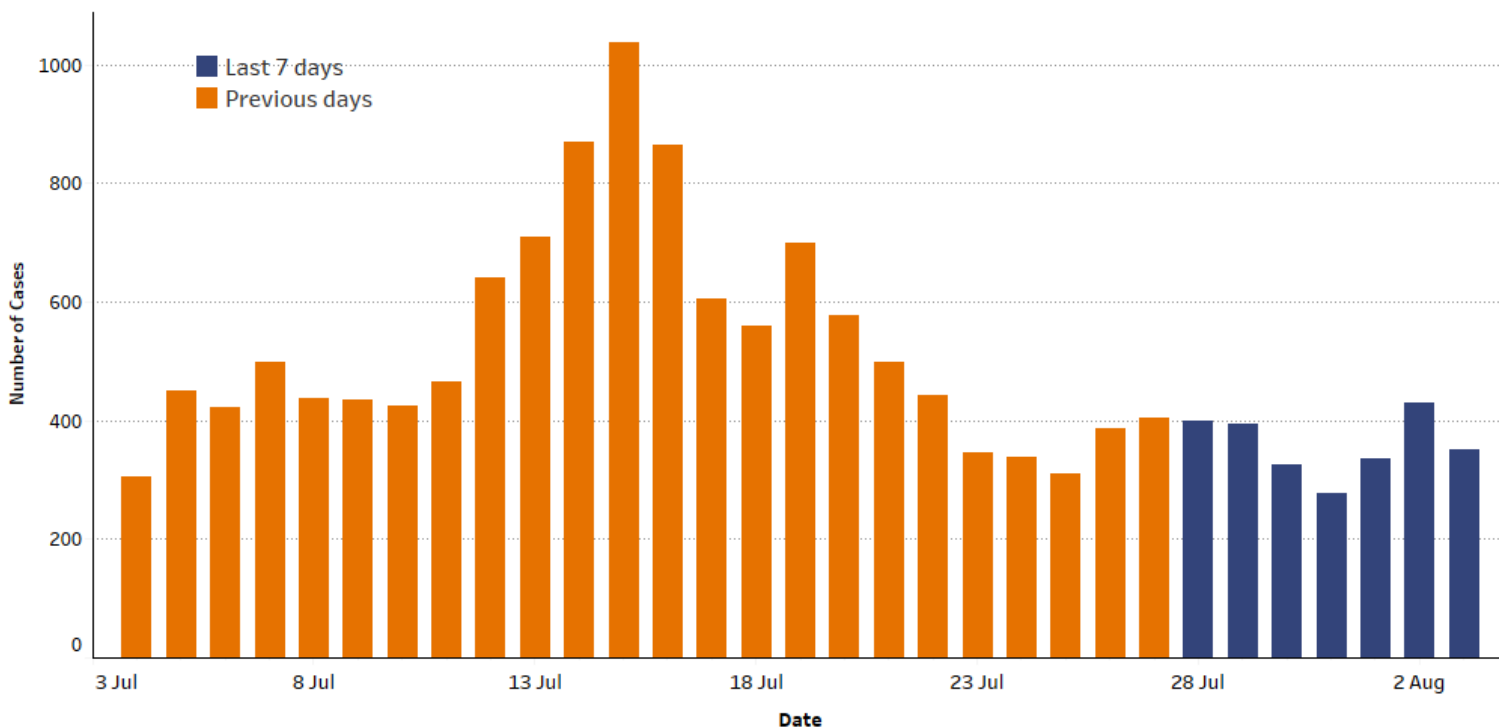

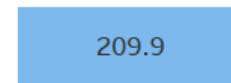

All data is publicly available. Data is shown by specimen date - reporting delays mean data can be incomplete for the most recent days. For this reason the data shown is for the seven-day period ending four days prior to the publication date.

The rate is calculated daily by Surrey County Council Public Health data intelligence team using the ONS 2019 mid-year population estimates.

The 7-day average line on the chart is calculated using the average of cases for three days before, the date itself and the three days after any specific date. The average is not calculated for the most recent three dates as there is not enough data.

# Hospital Admissions

There were **519** people admitted to hospital with COVID-19 in the last 7 days (28 July 2021 to 3 August 2021) in the South East. This is **32** fewer admission than than the previous week (21 July 2021 to 27 July 2021).

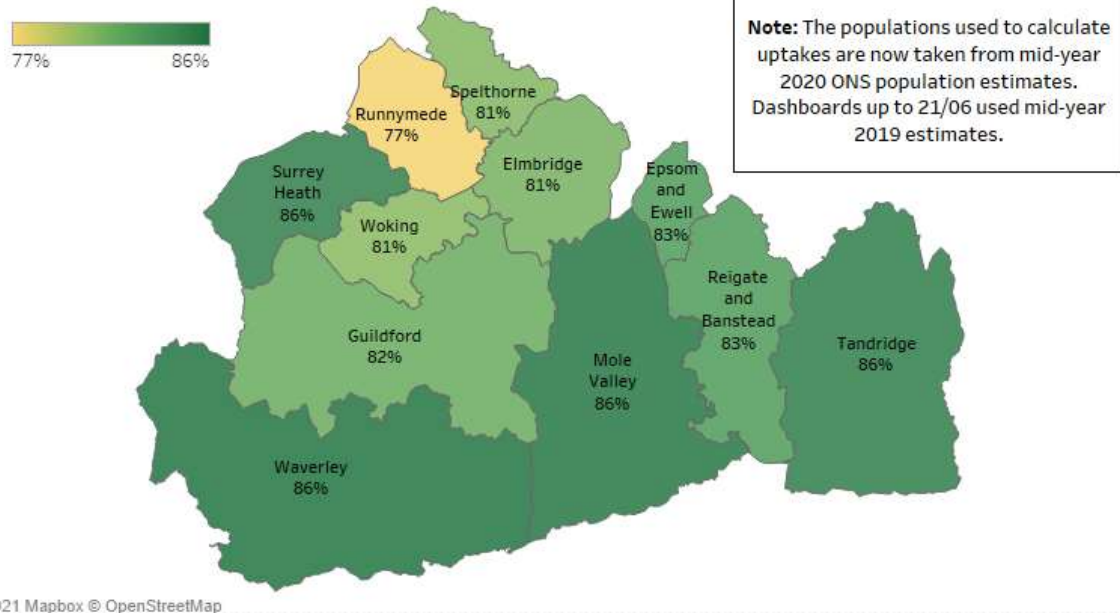

# Vaccinations

Data up to 4 August 2021

## Percentage of 18+ population who have had at least 1 dose of a vaccine



**2,652** people in Surrey have received their first dose, and **21,981** have received their second dose of a COVID-19 vaccination in this week (29 July 2021 to 04 August 2021).

In total **860,568** people (**83%** of the adult population) have received at least one dose of a vaccine, and **727,422** people (**70%** of the population) have received two doses of a vaccine (up to 04 August 2021).

**83%** of all people in the South East have had at least 1 dose of a vaccine, and **69%** have had a second dose, compared to **79%** and **65%** of people in England.

- People who are clinically vulnerable and clinically extremely vulnerable
- People who live or work in care homes
- Health and social care workers
- People with a learning disability
- People who are a main carer for someone at high risk (clinically extremely vulnerable)
