Amendments to Waiting and Loading Restrictions and On-Street Parking Places in the District of Mole Valley

On 16 May 2023 Surrey County Council made, with amendments, "The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Mole Valley) (Amendment of Waiting Loading and Unloading Prohibition and On-Street Parking Places Orders) (Amendment No.4) Order 2023", pursuant to Sections 1, 2, 4, 14, 32, 35, 36 and 45 to 53 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984: The purpose and effect of which is to amend the following Orders: -

- (1) The Surrey County Council Various Roads in The District of Mole Valley (Residents' On-Street Parking Places) Order 2017;
- (2) The Surrey County Council Various Roads in Dorking Town Centre in The District of Mole Valley (Permit Zone) (On-Street Parking Place) Order 2017;
- (3) The Surrey County Council Minchin Close Leatherhead Controlled Parking Zone in The District of Mole Valley (Revocation and Consolidation of Waiting Restrictions and On-Street Parking Places) Order 2017;
- (4) The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Mole Valley) (Consolidation of Free Street Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) Order 2017;
- (5) The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Mole Valley) (Consolidation of Free Street Parking Places and Loading Bays and Revocation) Order 2017;
- (6) The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Mole Valley) (Revocation and Consolidation of Waiting, Loading and Unloading Prohibition and Restriction) Order 2017;
- (7) The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Mole Valley) Electric Vehicle Parking Places Order 2022

So as to: -

(a) prohibit waiting by vehicles in certain lengths of the roads specified in the First Schedule to this Notice, on the days and at the times indicated in the said Schedule; Exemptions for loading on and unloading from vehicles, boarding and alighting from vehicles, using vehicles for works on or adjoining the lengths of roads referred to in the First Schedule, the maintenance of those roads and the services in them and for

- disabled persons' vehicles in accordance with the Blue Badge Scheme, will apply to the afore-mentioned restrictions;
- (b) amend the current waiting restrictions on certain lengths of roads specified in the Second Schedule to this Notice to the days and at the times indicated in the said Schedule;
- (c) amend the current loading and unloading restrictions on certain lengths of roads specified in the Third Schedule to this Notice to the days as at the times indicated in the said Schedule;
- (d) Introduce a time limited free parking bay outside No.60 and No.58 The Street, Charlwood with the restriction of 30 Minutes with no return within 1 hour Monday to Saturday 8am to 6pm
- (e) Introduce on-street permit holder's only parking places in certain lengths on Norfolk Road, Dorking with the letter identifier "BB" which will be in operation Monday to Saturday (inclusive) between 8am and 6pm with the following provisions:-
 - (1) the residents that may be eligible to apply for parking permits will be: "Whitby Villa", No's 1-5, "Tamworth" No.6, First Floor Flat No.6, No's 7-13, "Bernice" No.14, Flat 2 14A, Norfolk Road; 2 South Street Cottages, South Street; and "Holmbury Villa", "Fleet Villa" Vincent Lane;
 - (2) the vehicles which may be left in the parking place during the hours of operation shall be vehicles either displaying a valid residents parking or having a valid virtual residents parking permit bearing the appropriate identifying letter issued by the Council or its agents, or a vehicle either displaying a valid residents' visitor's parking permit, a valid carer's parking permit or a valid operational parking permit or having a valid virtual version thereof;
 - (3) provide residents' parking permits for residents of the said properties, which will allow them to park in the said on-street permit holders' only parking place during the hours of operation. Such permits will cost £80 for the first permit, £100 for a second permit and £130 for any subsequent permit (as applicable) and will be valid for a period of twelve months. These charges will rise by £4 on the 1st of January on each of 2024, 2026, and 2028. The charge for a duplicate permit or a change of permit due to the change of vehicle will be £15;

- (4) provide that such residents parking permits shall be allocated using the following calculation: the sum of the number of vehicles registered to the place of abode minus the number of off-street parking places for such place of abode;
- (5) provide for:
 - (a) residents to purchase permits for use by their visitors at a cost of £2 each, which will be valid for one day, subject to a limit of 150 pa, or £1 which will be valid for 2 hours limited to 250 pa;
 - (b) Operational Permits, for use by doctors and nurses, and Carers Permits, for carers and community care personnel who are required to make visits to residents, which will be free of charge; and
 - (c) Child Care Permits, for persons employed to visit a resident for the purpose of childcare, pursuant to a contract of employment, will incur the same cost as a resident's permit, dependant on how many permits the resident has already been issued;
- (6) provide that vehicles left by specified disabled persons may wait in the parking places in accordance with the Blue Badge Scheme without time limit at any time;
- (7) provide that certain other vehicles may wait in the parking places in certain circumstances e.g., to allow person to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes) etc;
- (8) provide that outside the hours of operation indicated, any vehicle may be left in the parking place for any period without time limit.
- (f) Include the residents of No.54a The Street, Ashtead to be eligible for permits in the Grove Road resident permit scheme (Permit Parking Zone "N"). The costs and conditions of use will be the same as in sub-paragraphs (d)(1) to (d)(8) (inclusive) above;
- (g) Include the residents of No.13 Linden Road, Leatherhead to be eligible for permits on Linden Road (Permit Parking Zone "AA"). The costs and conditions of use will be the same as in sub-paragraphs (d)(1) to (d)(8) (inclusive) above;
- (h) Include the residents of "The Forge" and "Forge Cottage", Ansell Road, and No.20 Jubilee Terrace, Dorking to be eligible for permits in Permit Parking Zone "J". The

- costs and conditions of use will be the same as in sub-paragraphs (d)(1) to (d)(8) (inclusive) above;
- (i) Provide such free disabled persons on-street parking places in the lengths of roads specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Notice, to be operational at all times without limit of time;
- (j) Introduce such electric vehicle on-street places in certain lengths of the roads specified in the Fifth Schedule to this Notice, to be used at the times and on the days specified therein by electric vehicles or hybrid vehicles for the purpose of charging the said vehicle by use of the electric vehicle charging post installed in respect of that parking place; and
- (k) make provision for virtual permits for all permit schemes in the District of Mole Valley Make certain drafting amendments to the following existing Orders which impose waiting, loading, and unloading and parking prohibitions and restrictions in the District of Mole Valley, which will not affect the operation of those prohibitions and restrictions: -
- (1) Surrey County Council Kingston Road (D2887) Leatherhead in the District of Mole Valley (Prohibition of Waiting of Heavy Commercial Vehicles) Order 2017;
- (2) The Surrey County Council Church Street (D2885) and High Street (D2885) Leatherhead (Prohibition of Waiting) (Restricted Zone) Order 2017;
- (3) The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Mole Valley) Prohibition of Stopping Outside Schools Order 2018

Where a restriction is proposed herein any existing restriction on the same length of road will be revoked, unless otherwise indicated.

A copy of the made Orders, which will come into operation on 19 May 2023, plans showing the lengths of roads to which the Orders relate and a Statement of the Council's reasons for making the Orders may be inspected, free of charge, at

- (3) Leatherhead Library and Help Shop, The Mansion, Church Street, Leatherhead, Surrey, KT22 8DP;

- (4) Bookham Library, Townshott Close, Great Bookham, Surrey, KT23 4DQ; all during normal opening hours; and
- (5) Mole Valley District Council, Pippbrook, Dorking, Surrey RH4 1SJ, during normal office hours.

If you wish to question the validity of any of the Orders or of any provision contained in any of those Orders on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Act, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to any of the Orders, you may, within six weeks from the date of the making of the Order, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

Any reference to a road in the Schedules is a reference to part of the road only.
