

**ALLOCATION OF RECEPTION SCHOOL PLACES IN THE BOROUGH OF MOLE VALLEY FOR SEPTEMBER 2016**

The data in this document sets out the reception allocation figures for the majority of Surrey's schools in the borough of Mole Valley as of 18 April 2016. In some cases vacancies remained after the initial allocation to on time applicants and these were filled by applicants who had applied late. Where no measurement is shown, all applicants who applied on time were offered a place. In all other cases measurements relate to the last criterion for which places were offered. All distances quoted are in kilometres.
