Guildford

Following the referral, an intake meeting will be offered to discuss what they are interested in attending, what their needs are, to ensure they can access zoom, to ask any questions etc.

If under 18, there must be an adult present for this meeting but not required for the sessions.
If they are interested in ESOL classes, they will meet with an English assessor to confirm what level class they need to be in. The current levels are :

Beginner- For those new to the country
Intermediate- College level
Advanced- Conversational English

In addition to the timetable, there are single language groups available for young people who are isolated to be able to converse with other young people who speak their language. It is also anticipated that in August, Maths and IT will be added to the timetable. The current homework group is led by the young people attending so that they receive specific subject support and they chose what help they need.

There is a caseworker within the team, and it is anticipated that when the online support ends next year, the case worker will work with the SW/PA to identify further support in the area.
