

List of construction waste which is subject to a charge

You can only bring construction waste to the CRCs in a car.

Charged per 50cm x 77 cm bag (can be a mix of any of the items below)

- Breeze blocks
- Bricks
- Ceramic drainpipes
- Concrete
- Flagstones or paving slabs
- Granite
- Gravel
- Marble
- Rocks or stones
- Rubble or hardcore
- Sand
- Set cement
- Slate
- Soil
- Tarmac
- Tiles (ceramic, clay or slate)
- Turf

Charged per item

- A piece of marble (if it won't fit in a 50cm x 77 cm bag)
- A piece of granite (if it won't fit in a 50cm x 77 cm bag)
- Bidets
- Ceramic baths
- Ceramic shower trays
- Ceramic pipes
- Cisterns
- Concrete fence posts
- Concrete gravel boards
- Formed concrete (if it won't fit in a 50cm x 77 cm bag)
- Toilet pans
- Set cement (if it won't fit in a 50cm x 77 cm bag)
- Sinks or wash basins
- Paving slabs (600mm x 600mm)

Plasterboard

Plasterboard and similar products such as room partitions which contain gypsum can be accepted in a 50cm x 77 cm bags, or in sheets no larger than 1,200cm x 2,400cm. Tiles, foam and other materials must be removed.
