

## Dagley Lane

### Application for consent under section 38 of the Commons Act 2006 to carry out restricted works



Surrey County Council is applying to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for consent under section 38 of the Commons Act 2006 to carry out restricted works on a section of Dagley Lane on Shalford Common, Shalford, GU4 8DA, either side of the bridge over the railway line. The Planning Inspectorate will decide the application on behalf of the Secretary of State.

The proposed works are the construction of a 3-metre-wide path with a bound surface which widens out as it crosses the railway bridge and then ties in with the existing paved road surface on Dagley Lane which adjoins A281 Horsham Road. The path would have a tarmac surface and be edged with either concrete or timber edgings. Lighting columns are planned at approximately 30 metre intervals. The surfacing would cover an area of 292 square metres of Common Land north of the railway bridge, and 94 square metres south of the railway bridge. Minor vegetation cut back would be carried out where required to enable the works.

The works on Common Land are part of a route section along Dagley Lane, extending north to Shalford Thames Water, for which Surrey County Council has funding to construct a high-quality facility for walkers and cyclists which is inclusive, safe, attractive and comfortable. This section is also part of a wider walkway and cycleway between Guildford and Godalming for which feasibility work is underway to establish plans to provide a high-quality route for walkers and cyclists.

Due to Government advice in respect of Coronavirus (COVID-19); a copy of the application will not be left in a public area for viewing.
