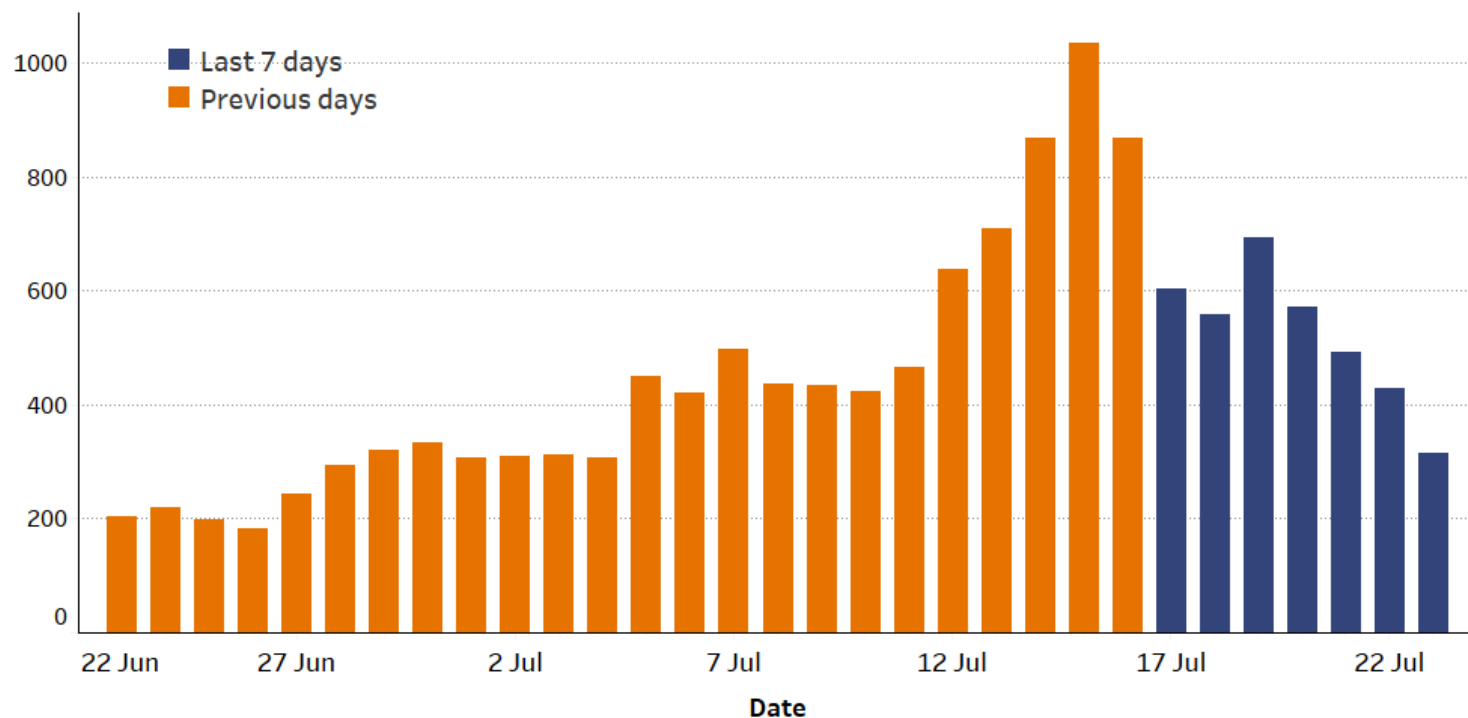

All data is publicly available. Data is shown by specimen date - reporting delays mean data can be incomplete for the most recent days. For this reason the data shown is for the seven-day period ending four days prior to the publication date.

The rate is calculated daily by Surrey County Council Public Health data intelligence team using the ONS 2019 mid-year population estimates.

The 7-day average line on the chart is calculated using the average of cases for three days before, the date itself and the three days after any specific date. The average is not calculated for the most recent three dates as there is not enough data.

Hospital Admissions

There were **478** people admitted to hospital with COVID-19 in the last 7 days (15th July to 21st July) in the South East. This is **173** more admissions than the previous week (8th July to 14th July).

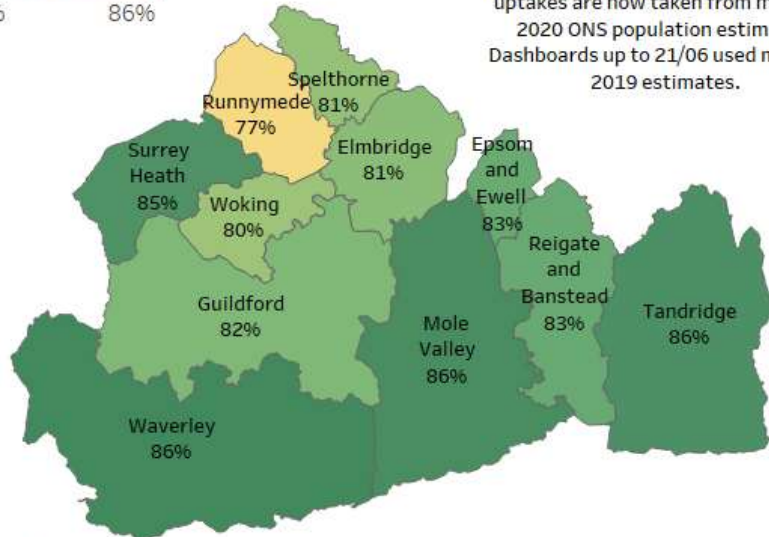

4,217 people in Surrey have received their first dose, and **27,384** have received their second dose of a COVID-19 vaccination this week (18th July to 24th July).

In total **855,935** people (**83%** of the adult population) have received at least one dose of a vaccine, and **696,034** people (**67%** of the population) have received two doses of a vaccine (up to 24th July).

82% of all people in the South East have had at least 1 dose of a vaccine, and **66%** have had a second dose, compared to **78%** and **62%** of people in England.
