**The Surrey County Council**  
**Various Roads in Lightwater and West End**  
**Temporary Prohibition of Traffic Order 2022**

On 28 June 2022 Surrey County Council made the above-mentioned Temporary Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to prohibit vehicles from entering or proceeding in the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Notice

This Order, which will commence on 30 June 2022 for a period of 18 months is required because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the said roads, to be carried out by or on behalf of Surrey County Council, including but not limited to: carriageway surfacing and/or major highway maintenance works.

Advanced warning signs will be displayed; and the temporary closure will only operate when the relevant traffic signs are displayed. Any vehicle found to be obstructing the highway during these works will be removed to outside the limits of the works after all reasonable methods have been undertaken to identify and contact the vehicle's owner.

Access for pedestrians and dismounted cyclists will be maintained at all times, as will access for emergency service vehicles in an emergency situation only. Vehicular access for residents and businesses will be maintained only when safe to do so, if necessary, via the diversion route. During certain phases of the works, vehicular access to premises may be restricted, when this is the case such restriction of access will apply for no more than eight hours within any 24-hour period.

**Schedule**

- (a) Briar Avenue (D3562) Lightwater as extends from its junction at the roundabout with (D3562) Burdock Close and (D3562) Blackthorn Drive to a point approximately 20 metres west of its junction with (D3562) Shrublands Drive.  
Alternative Route – Briar Avenue; MacDonald Road; Red Road; and Briar Avenue or this same route in reverse.
- (b) Malthouse Lane (D501) West End as extends from a point in line with the common boundary between No.48 and No.50 Malthouse Lane to its junction with (D501) Malthouse Lane in the vicinity of No.58 Malthouse Lane.
- (c) Bolding House Lane (D501) West End as extends from its junction with (D501) Malthouse Lane north-eastwards for a distance of approximately 40.

Alternative Route – Malthouse Lane; Benner Lane; Commonfields; and Malthouse Lane or this same route in reverse.
