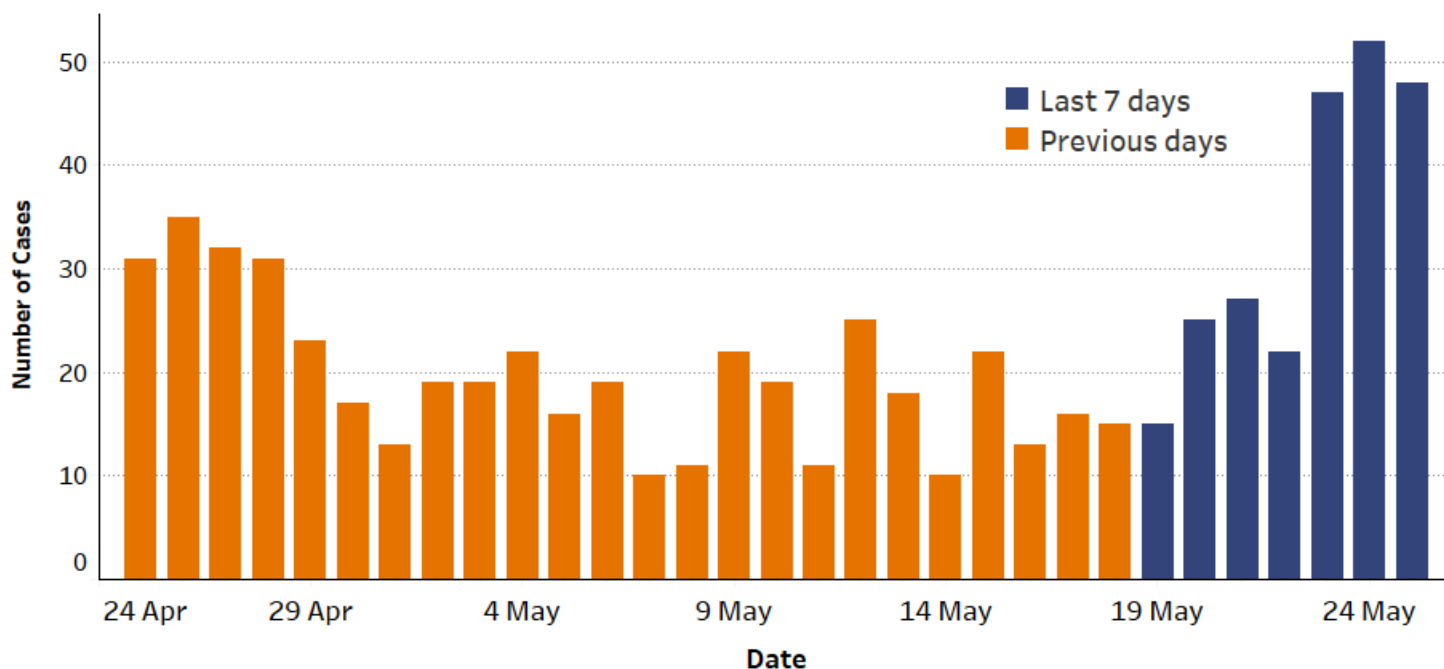

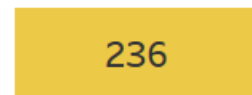

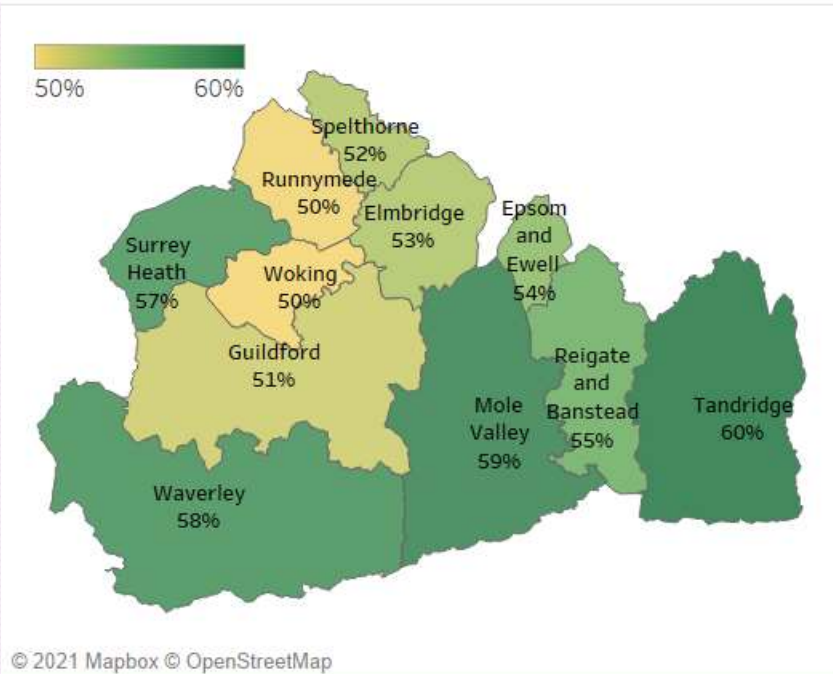

54% of all people in the South East have had at least 1 dose of a vaccine, and **33%** have had a second dose, compared to **51%** and **31%** of people in England.
