Pitch Hill (C46) Ewhurst
Temporary Prohibition of Traffic Order 2023

On 08 March 2023 Surrey County Council made the above-mentioned Temporary Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to prohibit vehicles from entering or proceeding in

(a) that length of Pitch Hill (C46) Ewhurst as extends from its junction with (D222) Moon Hall Road to its junction with (D222) Peaslake Road and (C46) Peaslake Road.

(b) that length of Shere Road (C46) Ewhurst as extends from its junction with (C46) Pitch Hill and (D222) Peaslake Road southwards for a distance of approximately 100 metres

(c) that length of Peaslake Road (D222) Ewhurst as extends from its junction with (C46) Pitch Hill and (C46) Shere Road northwestwards for a distance of approximately 70 metres

The Order is required to facilitate –

(1) new mains connection works and/or utility maintenance works to be carried out by, or on behalf of Morrisons Utility Services. These works are anticipated to be carried out over 6 days between the hours of 8am and 5pm commencing 27 March 2023. Alternative Route – (C46) Shere Road, (B2127) The Street, (B2127) Cranleigh Road, (B2127) Bookhurst Road, (D192) Barhatch Lane, (C46) Hound House Road and (C46) Pitch Hill; and

(2) excavation water works and/or utility maintenance works to be carried out by, or on behalf of High Voltage Systems & Services. These works are anticipated to be carried out over 14 days between the hours of 8am and 5pm commencing 03 April 2023. Alternative Route - (C46) Shere Road, (B2127) The Street, (B2127) Cranleigh Road, (B2127) Bookhurst Road, (D192) Barhatch Lane, (C46) Hound House Road and (C46) Pitch Hill

These works are anticipated to be carried out as soon as possible within the 12-month period of operation of this Temporary Traffic Order which commence on 27 March 2023. Advanced warning signs will be displayed, and the temporary closures, which are anticipated to be in force 24 hours per day, will only operate when the relevant traffic signs are displayed.

For parts (1) and part (2) access for emergency services, residents, pedestrians and dismounted cyclists will be maintained at all times and for part (1) this will be via the road plates when necessary, all other traffic will be required to use the signed diversion routes. Whilst works are in progress vehicular access to premises may be restricted, when this is

the case such restriction of access will apply for no more than eight hours within any 24-hour period.
