Surrey secondary schools are mixed gender and will accommodate boys and girls, apart from Glyn School (single sex boys' school) and Rosebery (single sex girls' school).

Number offered 2024/25

This has been included for the criterion under which the last applicant was offered a place. In some cases, vacancies remained after the initial allocation to on time applicants and these were filled by applicants who had applied late. This data is relevant to the allocation date of 1 March 2024.

UTCs (University Technical Colleges) and studio schools admit children at the beginning of Year 10. UTCs are set up by universities and businesses and specialise in one or two technical subjects. In Years 10 and 11 they offer a similar GCSE curriculum to a typical secondary school, including English and Maths, as well as their specialist subject(s). Studio schools are similar to UTCs in that they have employer involvement in the curriculum and focus on developing skills needed for employment, involving personal coaching and work experience. They have a similar curriculum to a typical secondary school.

Some other schools also only provide education from Year 10 and these are often schools which specialise in performing arts. These are listed where they are within a reasonable travelling distance of Surrey.

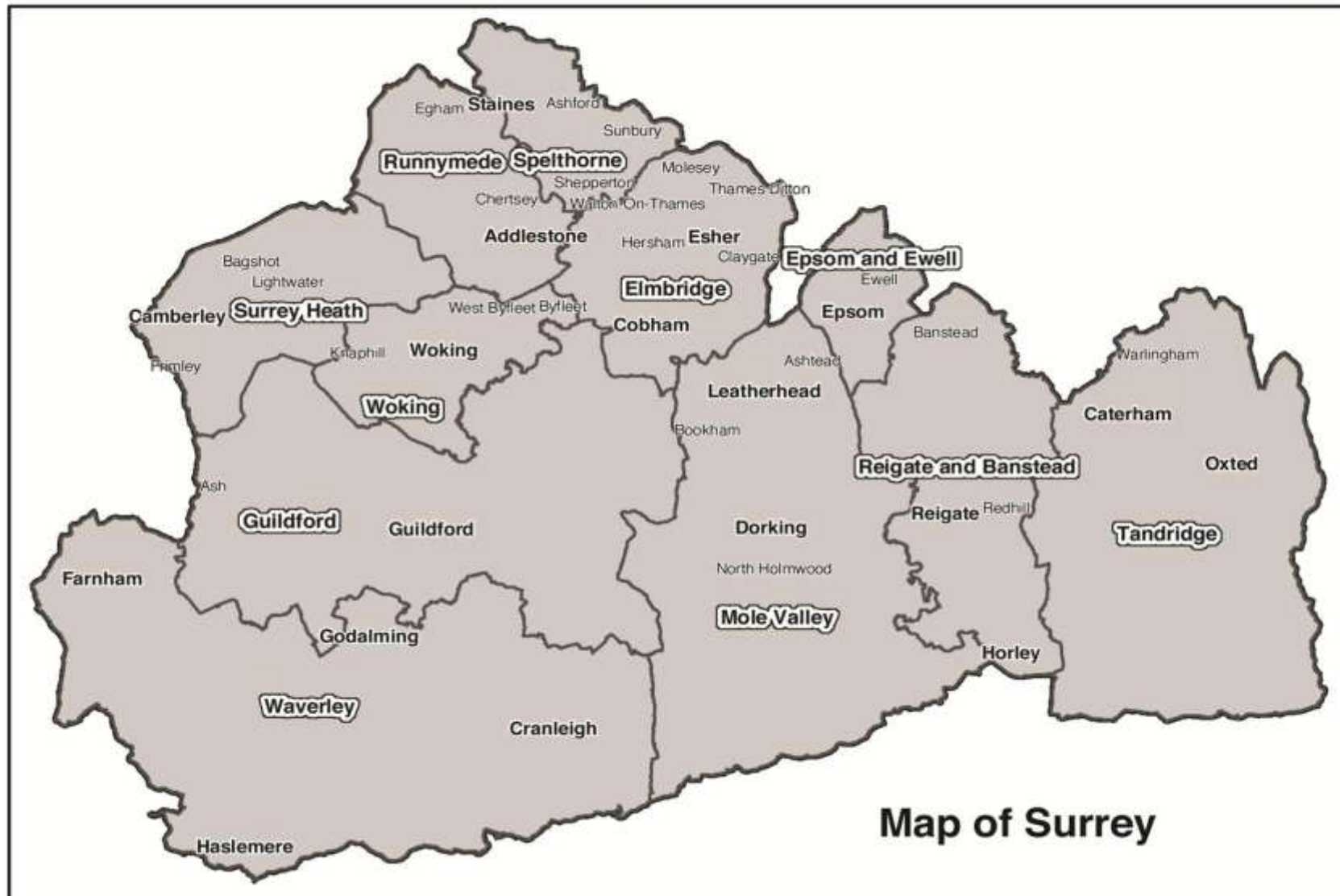
